

### A Word from Our Executive Director






In 2022, volunteer training needs were assessed. Training that would better equip our volunteers to serve was requested. We met with Executive Directors across the state, attended their trainings, and read the various national advocacy curriculums. It was determined that it would benefit our organization to write our own training program affording us the flexibility to train as we go as well and make the material specific to our centers.



Each session is specific in purpose. The first session is **Help**, covering what we do and how we do it. The second session is **Options**, training the advocate on the choices each client faces. The third session is the **Process**, which prepares the advocate to meet the client through active listening and crisis management. It ends with **Equip**, to prepare our volunteers to serve as Jesus did, sharing the gospel and connecting the client to resources, either local or national. We bring our clients HOPE!

On May 1, we rolled out the new manual and taught six trainers, who are experienced advocates, across the service area. We have now empowered our trainers to educate our volunteers as they are recruited. Together we can do more! Not only will this ensure volunteers are up to date on our ministry standards but they understand the boundaries and direction of our agency. Our new training program has been very well received and successful with over 30 new volunteers trained across our service area this summer. One of our volunteers said, "I feel more equipped and I know I can make a difference!"
